

Play-Based Pedagogy in Foundation Education: A Critical Analysis of NCFFS-2022

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Abstract

The national Curriculum Framework for Foundation Stage (NCFFS) 2022 which is introduced for the very first time marks a significant shift in India's Early Childhood education by emphasizing play-based pedagogy as the cornerstone of learning. This article critically examines the conceptual foundations, pedagogical implications and implications challenges of play-based learning as proposed in NCFFS 2022. It highlights how play fosters joyful, stress free learning environment also highlights the power of play, outlining different types of play and its benefits. Also focuses on holistic development of the children which includes cognitive, affective (social-emotional), Psychomotor (physical growth) domain, significance of NCFFS 2022 its challenges and limitation on the study. The article also addressing concerns related to teacher's preparedness, infrastructure and assessment practices of the teachers teaching in the foundation stage. Present article examines how play based pedagogies is crucial for achieving holistic development among children and understanding the impact of different types of play on the all-round development of the children. The analysis underscores the need for systemic support to effectively translate policy into practice and understand the Indian's vision for high quality early childhood care and education.

Introduction

The landmark policy document i.e., National Curriculum Framework for Foundation Stage (NCFFS) 2022 is developed in alignment with the vision of the National Educational Policy (NEP) 2020 with a vision to transform early childhood care and education (ECCE) in India. Ministry of Education, Government of India, introduced it to provide a comprehensive curricular and pedagogical framework for children of the age group of 3 to 8 years which covers preschool education along with Grades 1 and 2. The framework recognizes the foundational stage as the most critical phase for cognitive, emotional, physical, linguistic, social and ethical development of children (Ministry of Education, 2022).

In NCFFS 2022 it emphasizes that young children learn best through play, interaction, activity, experience and discovery rather than through rote memorization and formal

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instruction. Therefore, the present framework advocates a shift from traditional teacher-centered methods to child-centered with an emphasized on play-based pedagogical practices. It integrates principles of joyful learning, flexibility, inclusivity, multilingualism and cultural relevance to ensure holistic development and school readiness.

The present framework is based on contemporary research in childhood, neuroscience and early childhood education, as well as Indian educational traditions. It draws inspiration from the ideas of educational thinking such as Jean Piagets, Lev Vygotsky and Friedrich Froebel, who emphasized learning through interaction, activity and play. NCFFS 2022 also aligns with Sustainable Development Goal 4 (SDG-4), which focuses on ensuring inclusive and equitable quality education for all.

A major feature of NCFFS 2022 is its emphasis on Foundational Literacy and Numeracy (FLN), which aims to ensure that every child acquires basic reading, writing and numeracy skills by Grade-3. The framework proposes the use of storytelling, games, music, art, conversation, and hands-on experiences as effective pedagogical tools for achieving learning outcomes. Additionally, it encourages the active involvement of families and communities in children's learning processes.

The NCFFS 2022 also addresses the need for teacher capacity building, inclusive classrooms, and flexible assessment methods and contextualized learning materials. By promoting free play, guided play and structured play, NCFFS 2022 seeks to create joyful and stress-free learning environment that nurture curiosity, creativity, critical thinking and lifelong learning habits among children.

Thus, NCFFS 2022 represents a progressive and transformative step towards strengthening foundational education in India and ensuring holistic development during early years of childhood.

The National Curriculum Framework for foundation stage (NCFFS) 2022 marks a significant reform in Indian's education system, aligning with the vision of the national education policy (NEP 2020). It focuses on children aged 3-8 years, covering pre-primary to Grade II, and represents the first-ever integrated framework for Early Childhood Care education (ECCE) in India. This framework acknowledge that the foundation years are critical for cognitive, social, emotional and physical development, laying the groundwork for lifelong learning.

Conceptual Foundation of NCFFS 2022

NCFFS 2022 is based on the 5+3+3+4 curricular structure proposed in NEP 2020, where the foundational stage comprises five years of flexible, play based learning. The early years of a child's life are crucial for laying the foundation of lifelong learning and development. Recognizing this, NCFFS-2022 aligns with the vision of the National Education Policy 2020, advocating for a shift from rote learning to experiential and play-based pedagogy is not merely an instructional techniques but a child-centered philosophy that views learning as an active, joyful and meaningful process.

Play-based pedagogy as envisioned in NCFFS 2022 represents a progressive step towards transforming foundational education in India. It acknowledges the importance of joyful and

holistic learning experiences. However, its success depends on effective teacher training, infrastructural support, and robust assessment frameworks. A collaborative efforts among policymakers, educators and communities is essential to bridge the gap between policy and practice and to ensure that every child benefits from this transformative approach.

Rationale:

The study examines integration of play based pedagogy in the early childhood care and education. It aims to target the learners by evolving as an involved learners. The research aimed to ensure high-quality education which is a vision of NEP 2020 for all children of age group of 3-6 years by 2025. It definitely contributes valuable knowledge to policymakers, educators, and stakeholders, and works in the direction of reaching up to the vision of becoming the global knowledge super power.

Statement of the Problem:

Objectives of the study:

1. To explore the Play-based Pedagogy in the pre-primary education context, as mentioned in NCF-FS 2022
2. To analyzed critically play-based pedagogy of pre-primary education (NCF-FS 2022).

Methodology:

The present study is based on comprehensive literature review and policy analysis examines the integration of play-based pedagogy in pre-primary education. The qualitative approach involves analysis of policy recommendation, educational theories and practical application of play-based pedagogy at pre-primary level.

Objectives 1: To explore the Play-based Pedagogy in the pre-primary education**Concept of play-based pedagogy**

Play-based pedagogy refers to an approach where learning occurs through play which includes free, guided and structure play as mentioned in NCFFS 2022. It integrates structured and unstructured play to promote curiosity, exploration and creativity. NCFFS 2022 conceptualized play as a natural mode of learning for children aged 3-8 years, emphasizing activities such as storytelling, games, music, aft, and hand' s on experiences.

Key Features of Play-Based Pedagogy in NCFFS 2022

1. Holistic Development Focus: NCFFS 2022 emphasized the development of Cognitive, linguistic, social-emotional, ethical and physical domains through play. Learning is interdisciplinary rather than compartmentalized.
2. Experiential Learning: Children learn by doing, exploring, and interacting with their environment. Play activities are designed to connect with real-life experiences.

3. Joyful and Stress-Free Learning: The frame discourages early academic pressure and formal testing, promoting a joyful classroom environment.
4. Cultural and Contextual Relevance: Local games, stories and traditions are incorporated to make learning meaningful and relatable.
5. Inclusive Education: Play-based methods cater to diverse learners, including children with different abilities and backgrounds.

Learning through play

National Curriculum framework for foundation stage (NCFFS-2022) emphasis 'play' as important component for conceptual, operational and transformational approach to curriculum organization, content organization, pedagogy and time for the child holistic development.

According to NCFFS-2022 the term play in the context of ECCE includes all activities that are enjoyable, engaging and have fun to the child. It can be physical play, interactive, conversational, question and answer session, storytelling, read-aloud and shared reading, riddles, rhymes or other enjoyable activities involving games, toys, visual art, and music.

Play which is a need for any child, can provide active and stimulating learning opportunities to children. Play in the classroom can be organized in different ways by the teacher (as mentioned in NCFFS) in order to have effective learning through play way method:

According to NCFFS 2022, play based pedagogy includes different forms of play experiences such as free play, guided play and structured play. These approaches help children learn in joyful, meaningful and developmentally appropriate ways.

- i. **Free play:** According to NCFFS 2022, free play refers to play activities that are initiated, controlled and enjoyed by children themselves without direct adult instruction or rigid rules. Children freely choose what, how, and with whom they want to play. NCFFS recognizes free play as a natural and essential mode for learning during the foundation stage i.e., 3-8 years. It is child-centric and voluntary where no fixed learning outcomes imposed by teachers. Here teacher encourage imagination, creativity, flexibility and spontaneous. It is driven by children's interest and curiosity. Here teacher acts as observer and facilitator.
- ii. **Guided play:** It is a form of play where the child remains actively involved and free to explore, but the teacher intentionally guides the learning process towards specific educational goals. NCFFS 2022 emphasizes that in guided play, the educator acts as a facilitator rather than a strict instructor. It is a child-centric and interactive approach. Here teacher provides supports, prompts and encouragement. The learning objectives are planned by the teacher beforehand. The teacher during guided play encourage exploration, creativity and problem-solving. In this method of play, balance between freedom and play were created by the teacher. Eg, Storytelling followed by role play or Language development through conversation games.
- iii. **Structured play (also known as Directed play):** It refers to organized play activities designed with clear rules, objectives materials and teacher direction. In NCFFS 2022,

structured play is used to achieve specific learning outcomes in a systematic manner. It is teacher-directional activities. Here there is Pre-Planned rules and procedures. The objectives to be achieved are specific. The teacher during this play give limited but purposeful freedom. It is time bound and organized.

Significance of NCFFS 2022

1. **Strengthening Foundational Literacy and Numeracy:** It Supports national initiatives like NIPUN Bharat, ensuring that every child achieves basic literacy and numeracy.
2. **Bridging ECCE and School Education:** For the first time, Pre-Primary education are integrated into a continuous learning continuum.
3. **Child-Centric Education:** Shifts focus from teacher-led instruction to child-centered learning.
4. **Reducing Learning Gaps:** By focusing on early years, it addresses disparities and ensures equitable learning opportunities.

Objective 2: To analyzed critically play-based pedagogy of pre-primary education (NCF-FS 2022).

Critical Analysis of NCFFS 2022: Although play-based pedagogy has been strongly recommended in NCFFS 2022 for promoting holistic and joyful learning, its effective implementation faces several challenges. The integration of play-based pedagogies offers numerous strength yet there are challenges and limitation in implementing these approach in the pre-primary context. Following limitation significantly affect the successful integration of play-based learning in foundation education.

- a) **Resource Constraints:** One of the major limitation in implementing play-based pedagogy is the lack of infrastructure and adequate resources, particularly in the government schools situated in rural area. Effective execution of play-based learning requires sufficient classroom space, teaching-learning materials, toys, activity kits, outdoors plays areas and child-friendly furniture. However many schools, faces shortages of basic facilities, making it difficult to organize meaningful play activities. Overcrowded classroom and limited financial support further hinder the proper execution of experiential and activity based learning. NCFFS 2022 itself emphasizes the importance of a ‘safe and stimulating environment’ and recognizes that play should remain central to learning.
- b) **Teacher Training:** Teaches play a central role in implementing pay-based pedagogy, yet many educators are not adequately trained in child-centered and experiential teaching methods. Traditional teaching practices focused on rote memorization and textbook learning continue to dominate classrooms. Many teachers lack professional development opportunities related to guided play, classroom management during activities and integration of play with learning outcomes. As a result, play is something misunderstood as merely recreational rather educational, reducing its effectiveness in achieving foundational competencies.

- c) **Parents Awareness:** Another significant challenge is the limited awareness among parents regarding the educational value of play. Many parents associate quality education with formal instruction, homework, and early academic achievements. Consequently, play-based activities are often perceived as a waste of time rather than a meaningful learning process. This misconception creates pressure on schools and teachers to prioritize traditional academic methods over playful and experiential learning approaches. Lack of parental support can therefore obstruct the successful implementation of play-based pedagogy.
- d) **Assessment Practices:** Assessment in play-based pedagogy remains a challenging area. Traditional assessment systems mainly focus on written examinations, memorization and measurable academic outcomes, which may not accurately capture the holistic development of children. Skills such as creativity, collaboration, communication, problem-solving and socio-emotional growth are difficult to assess through conventional methods. Many teachers also lack training in observation based and formative assessment techniques recommended by NCFFS 2022. This mismatch between pedagogy and assessment practices limits the effectiveness of play-based education.
- e) **Cultural relevance:** India is a culturally diverse country with variations in languages, traditions, socioeconomic conditions, and educational practices. Designing play activities that are culturally relevant and contextually appropriate for all children is a complex task. In some communities, traditional beliefs may discourage playful learning or undervalued early childhood education. Additionally, imported educational materials and activities may not always reflect local cultural and children's lived experiences. Without contextual adaptation, play-based pedagogy may fail to engage learners effectively.

Despite these challenges, the implementation of NCFFS 2022 has significant strengths:

Strength

- **Child-Centered Approach:** The framework places the child at the center of the learning process, respecting individual pace and interests.
- **Alignment with Global Practices:** Play-based learning is widely recognized internationally as effective in early childhood education.
- **Focus on Foundational Literacy and Numeracy (FLN):** Play is used as a medium to achieve FLN goals in an engaging manner.
- **Reduction of Academic Burden:** By discouraging rote memorization, NCFFS promotes deeper understanding.

Challenges and Limitation

- **Teacher Preparedness:** Many teachers lack training in implementing play-based pedagogy effectively, often reverting to traditional methods.

- Infrastructure Constraints: Schools, especially in rural areas, may lack adequate space and materials for play-based activities.
- Assessment Issues: Measuring learning outcomes in play-based environment remains complex and underdeveloped.
- Misinterpretation of Play: There is a risk equating play with lack of structure, leading to ineffective learning if not properly guided.
- Policy-Practice Gap: Translating the vision of NCFFS into classroom reality requires strong monitoring and support system.

Implications for Teachers and Teacher Education

Teachers play a pivotal role in the successful implementation of play-based pedagogy. There is a need for:

- Continuous professional development programs
- Training in activity-based and experiential learning strategies
- Development of reflective teaching practices
- Integration of play-based methods in teach education curricula
